Accordingly, the OVC-funded Center for Victim Research (CVR) is creating a collection of open-access instruments (i.e. survey instruments, interview/focus group protocols, and logic models).

We are looking to connect with individuals willing to share any of their own instruments with CVR and their colleagues in this important work. For survey instruments and interview/focus group protocols, we are particularly interested in those measuring victimization, victim service satisfaction, community and victim needs, and victim outcomes. Logic models from a wide variety of victim service programs are also desired.

Collected instruments will be catalogued in a way that makes them easily searchable and fully discloses authorship credit and background information on the instrument's development and usage. We hope that this collection will assist victim service providers and researchers alike in conducting various forms of research and evaluation.
