

Searching the Center for Victim Research Library Collection

The CVR Library full collection includes both open access research and subscription articles from journals that focus on research about crime victims and survivors, like Violence Against Women, Trauma, Violence & Abuse and Violence & Victims.

To access these resources, login to CVR's website, open the library page (victimresearch.org/library), and enter a simple keyword search in the search box.
