- 3. Include prefix "A" and the number of the question you are replying to (ex. A2:, A3:, A4:, etc.)
- 4. Type out your thoughts!
- 5. End your response with #CVRchat so others can follow the conversation.
- 6. (Optional) Engage with us or others participating by posing your own or responding to others' questions!

Guidelines:

- Twitter posts can only be 280 characters (including links/tags/hashtags).
- Each question will start with a prefix "Q1:" and each response needs to also include prefix "A1:" etc. corresponding to the question number.
- Answers can be split into multiple tweets. Label each segment with (1/3), (2/3), (3/3) at the end so others know the order to read them in. Though they can be split, it is better to keep it to 1 or 2 tweets maximum.
- Make sure to include #CVRchat in each of your responses. If a response is split into multiple segments, include #CVRchat at the end of each segment!
